The regular meeting of the North Little Rock City Council scheduled for Monday, September 24, 2018, was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by the Honorable Mayor Joe A. Smith.

The roll having been called and the following Council Members answered to their names: DEBI ROSS, BETH WHITE, LINDA ROBINSON, STEVE BAXTER, RON HARRIS, CHARLIE HIGHT and MURRY WITCHER (7/0). Council Member MAURICE TAYLOR was not present during roll call. Assistant City Clerk Katelyn Thomas, Deputy City Clerk Talor Shinn, and City Attorney Amy Fields were also present.

The prayer and pledge of allegiance were led by Mayor Smith.

On the motion of Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Ross and by consent of all members present, the minutes from the North Little Rock City Council meeting held on Monday, September 10, 2018, were approved, accepted and filed as prepared by the City Clerk (7/0).

Council Member Taylor entered the council chambers at 6:01 p.m.

On the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Baxter, and by consent of all members present, communication #1 was read, accepted and filed (8/0).

1. Jason Carter Attorney at Law, memorandum re: Risk Management Committee Quarterly Report (Q2, FY18).

Jason Carter, Attorney at Law, provided the City Council with a summary of the Risk Management Committee Quarterly Report for the second quarter. The City generated revenue in the amount of twenty-six thousand, four hundred sixty-eight dollars (\$26,468.00) through FGR transactions. Mr. Carter advised the City Council that recommendations for changes should be forthcoming from the Risk Management Committee to better assist with fluctuations in the market.

On the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Baxter, and by consent of all members present, communication #2 was not read, accepted and filed (8/0).

2. Joyce Brewer, North Little Rock Resident, email re: Recycling price rise.

On the motion of Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Hight, and by consent of all members present, communication #3 was read, accepted and filed (8/0).

3. Mayor Smith, letter to City Council re: approved public infrastructure improvement grant for First Orion Corporate Headquarters job expansion, 600 Main building and future Argenta developments. Mayor Smith commended Todd Larson, Economic Development Director, on his effort in aiding the City with the grant. Mayor Smith stated the grant saved the City almost nine-hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000.00) to create a corridor on 6<sup>th</sup> street. He explained the importance of investing in economic development and economic development executives to gain knowledge.

Mayor Smith provided an update from Scott Springer, North Little Rock Electric Department, regarding the weekend weather that caused power outages in Dixie, Indian Hills, and downtown Argenta. The cause was due to various animals effecting circuits.

Mayor Smith distributed an article to Council Members and present reporters concerning an opinion on what is killing recycling.

Mayor Smith invited North Little Rock Fire Marshal John Pflasterer to come forward. Mr. Pflasterer introduced Mr. Deronda Bryant before the City Council. Mr. Bryant pulled a gentleman from an active burning structure to safety. Mr. Bryant tended to the victim while he instructed bystanders to call 911. Mr. Pflasterer commended Mr. Bryant on his act of heroism and presented him with a proclamation. Mayor Smith thanked Mr. Bryant for his bravery.

Mayor Smith announced citizen public comment on legislation. Ms. DeLynn Hearn spoke regarding R-18-186. She believes the issue of recycling contamination is due to lack of education. Ms. Hearn feels that residents prefer a listing of what can or cannot be recycled that can be referred back to. She also stated that Waste Management was not being effective. Ms. Hearn suggested penalties within the contract if Waste Management does not follow through on their terms. She would also approve of rewards if Waste Management reached beyond their goals. Mayor Smith advised Mr. Mohammad Butte that he would have a chance to speak on item R-18-189 when the piece of legislation was called. Mr. Mohammad did not speak at this time. Joyce Williams spoke regarding R-18-186. She is a resident of Ward 4 and spoke to Council Member Hight the previous week concerning the item. Ms. Williams does not mind paying to recycle, however she feels there is no benefit to recycling if Waste Management claims residents are not following procedures and the items end up in the landfill. Ms. Williams has no issues with designated areas in parking lots for recycling drop off if there was no fee being charged. She acknowledged parking lots could get messy. Ms. Williams feels like residents are doing Waste Management's job. She would like for the City to look into the cost benefit to recycling.

FOR RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING CURBSIDE PICK-UP SERVICES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. Mayor Smith stated he has put in many hours and days to negotiate contracts for recycling. He referenced the previous statements made during public comment and acknowledged that those concerns had already been discussed. Mayor Smith has focused on the numbers and concluded that Waste Management recycles a large portion for the City. Thirty-one percent (31%) is being sent to the landfill due to contamination by residents, however sixty-seven percent (67%) is being recycled. If the contract is not renewed, it could take 200 City garbage trucks full and compressed of twenty-two thousand (22,000 lbs) pounds, which equals a month and a half worth of garbage, that would have to go to the cities landfill. Other options were explored, however were not feasible or affordable. Mayor Smith said the City would work on lowering the contamination rate. Council Member Ross has an issue voting on a contract that the City has not seen yet. She proposed an amendment that would require the contract before a final

vote. Council Member Ross highlighted portions of the 2014 contact that Waste Management hasn't followed through on. She wants to make sure the future contact has the same items. Waste management has failed to tag bins as stated in the 2014 contact along with numerous other items. Mayor Smith said one of the big changes in the new contract will be the tagging of bins. Waste management will help the City with the problematic areas. There are three (3) neighborhoods that are not in compliance. They will be focused on. Mayor Smith said the efforts of education is to ensure future recycling costs stay the same or possible become lower. Council Member Ross said the input she has received from residents is split in half. Some residents want to keep recycling, the other half wants to do away with it. Council Member Ross reiterated that her concern is the contract. The amendment would ensure the contract would come before City Council. Council Member Robinson asked if glass would be additional money for the landfill since it would no longer be recyclable under the new contract. Mayor Smith said yes. The City pays by the pound and it would add to the weight. On the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Witcher, the resolution was amended. (8/0) On the motion of Council Member Witcher and seconded by Council Member Hight, and with the vote of the Mayor, the resolution was adopted as amended. (5/4)

They were having difficulty securing a new billboard site within the thirty (30) day time limit. Council Member Ross asked Ms. Fields how the nine (9) month time period was determined. Ms. Fields explained that she proposed three (3) months duration and the billboard owners requested twelve (12) months. They met in the middle and agreed upon nine (9) months. On the motion of Council Member Robinson and seconded by Council Member Baxter, and the roll having been called, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0).

Mr. Taylor expressed his frustration over the situation. Mayor Smith read each National Night Out location and the corresponding times. Council Member Steve Baxter will be promoted to Chief Master Sargent the following Wednesday. Mayor Smith held a voice vote to reschedule the November 12<sup>th</sup> Council meeting to November 13<sup>th</sup> due to Veterans Day. All Council Members voted in the affirmative.

There being no further business to come before the Council, and on the motion of Council Member Ross and seconded by Council Member Witcher, and by consent of all members present, the meeting was adjourned at 7:02 p.m. (8/0), until the next regularly scheduled meeting to be held on Monday, October 8, 2018, at six o'clock p.m. in the City Council Chambers in City Hall, located at 300 Main Street, North Little Rock, Arkansas.
