A. Business Retention and & Expansion

B. Workforce Education and Development Program

- Worked with the SBA to develop 3 1-hour education sessions for North Little Rock businesses owners. Sessions held on 9/11, 18 and 25th. Subject matter:

C. High School Leadership Program

The Education Committee has been hard at work revamping the Leadership program organized by the North Little Rock Chamber of Commerce. The Chairs of the committee are Chris Shelton with First Security Bank, and Patrick Jacob with the Army National Guard. The overall goal for the Education committee this year was to gain more business involvement. The average attendance of our committee meetings in the spring was approximately five members, consisting mainly of educators. We now have fifteen to twenty members at every education meeting, half of which are business professionals.

The youth leadership program organized by the Chamber, formerly known as Leadership Renaissance, has recently been rebranded. The rebranding occurred after a program called "Renaissance Leadership" was launched at the High School, with goals parallel to ours. The rebranding processes began this past May. The program, now called ALPS which stands for Advancement, Leadership, Personal Growth and Service, has been completely rebranded and revamped. We have had four meetings consisting of the entire education committee, and five smaller focus group meetings to decide on our goals for the program and our pathway to accomplish those goals.

Chris and Emily had the pleasure of presenting the program to the North Little Rock High School Center of Excellence students on August 27. Through this speaking engagement, not only did the program gain interest of the students but also the interest of teachers. We were pleased to have teachers encouraging the students to take part in our program. The applications closed on September 6. After, a focus group reviewed each application anonymously and selected <u>32 NLR</u> students to participate in ALPS.

On September 17, the students will have the opportunity to meet the board of the North Little Rock Chamber of Commerce following their tour of the Center of Excellence at the High School. Prior to the meet and greet with our board members the students will have a short lesson on soft skills and professional introductions. Following the "Meet the Board Night", the students and their parents will attend an orientation on October 9, covering the expectations of the program, and assigning Chamber Member Mentors. The ALPS program has three main sessions.

The first session is on October 16 and will cover Social Service and Financial Literacy. The students will be broken into groups based on their results from a personality test, each group consisting of every personality type. (This teaches the students how to work with differing personalities.) Each group will visit a different non-profit and will not only volunteer with them but also lead a meeting with the staff to understand what they, as students, can do to help the non-profit meet some of their needs. That afternoon TruService Federal Credit Union will be doing an exercise with the students to teach financial literacy.

The second session is on November 13 and will cover Government and Law. On this day the students will be going out to Camp Robinson where they will get to do multiple hands-on activities to promote team building, but also to understand what our military actually does. After, the students will participate in a texting/drinking and driving simulation with the North Little Rock Police. Through this simulation we hope the students will better comprehend the harm they not only could cause themselves, but also others on the road when they text or drink and drive. Finally, Congressman French Hill, Senator Bozeman, and Senator Jane English will visit with the students on the importance of voter registration and how to make a change through writing a bill.

The third, and finial session of ALPS will be on December 11 and will cover Business and Industry. The students will have the opportunity to tour Caterpillar and Ben E. Keith Foods, giving them some insight at the opportunities we have here in North Little Rock. After, the students will be creating a simpler version of a business plan, called a Lean Canvas, for a business they would like to start in the future. With their Lean Canvases they create they will compete in "Shark Tank", with our Sharks being local entrepreneurs.

Each session of the ALPS program gives students hands on activity, but also something they can use years after completing the program. From engagement with volunteering, writing a bill, voting, and starting their own businesses these students will be coming engaged and involved citizens in our community.
