Charlotte is a native of North Little Rock, Arkansas. She has served under eight administrations with the North Little Rock Mayor's Office and has faithfully serviced the citizens for 48 years. Charlotte is the first African American employee in the North Little Rock Mayor's Office.

Charlotte received her Bachelor of Arts from Philander Smith College and participates in various civic and social organizations including: SA Jones Alumni and choir, Beta Pi Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and NAACP. Charlotte's heritage in North Little Rock runs deep. Her father, Samuel Holloway,

was the first American African business owner in the Glenview community. Mr. Holloway and his wife, Elizabeth, created Holloway Delivery and Installation Service and operated the business for over 40 years. Charlotte's father was also named the first Chief of the North Little Rock Auxiliary Police Force, an African American group created in the early 1960s. He also served for 10 years on the North Little Rock Parks & Recreation Commission.

Charlotte is a member of Mt. Ararat Baptist Church where she serves as Choir member, Church Program Director and Deaconess Leader. Charlotte has served on the North Little Rock Census Committee, the Study Committee at Pulaski County Special School District, and the Arkansas Historic Preservation Society. She participates in North Little Rock City Mission, Anointed Praise Chorale and the S.A. Jones Alumni Choir. She enjoys gardening and spending time with her family.

Charlotte has received community recognition for her faithful service and longevity and was named a Woman of Distinction by The North Little Rock Times and numerous other awards and distinctions. She was recognized by STAND newspaper as a leader within the community.

Charlotte has a magnetic personality and a heart and passion to help others. She is a Class Act and we are blessed to have her continue her service to our citizens and the many organizations for which she volunteers. Many citizens call and specifically request Charlotte's help because of her years of humble service and knowledge of City protocol.
