Updates:

- 1. Park Hill Business and Merchants Association intends to hold the Tour de Bark event again next year and is also planning to host monthly events the last Thursday of the month starting in July! There will be food trucks and beer sales!
- 2. Levy Business Association has started collecting membership dues and includes businesses inside and outside of the overlay plan area.
- 3. The legal department has said that it is not possible to pass an ordinance to make the Park Hill Elementary site a PUD (Planned Unit Development) before the new owners apply for rezoning. Therefore, a meeting will be held to plan and discuss the possibilities for ensuring the site is developed in a way that will complement the overlay. All are welcome. Meeting details will be shared as they are known.
- 4. Richard Magee, Deputy Director from Metroplan, gave a report on street improvement project status. Metroplan staff has compiled a list of projects (including costs) from all 7 Jump Start areas and are submitting the list to their Board in August. Once the projects are approved, the RFQs/RFPs will be sent out to consulting firms for the streetscape improvement design. The engineering design process will take up to a year. Metroplan has the money for these projects (assuming Congress extends the current transportation bill) and each city will be expected to match 20% of their project(s) total costs. Ground breaking could begin as early as federal fiscal year 2017.

 - a. engaging the community through communication and collaboration,
 - b. encouraging investment,
 - c. what else?

We will vote on missions through email and work on developing 1-4 major goals at next month's meeting. Please send Jenna your ideas for goals and she will bring those to the July meeting. The vision and mission notes are below to help us remember what we want to happen. These concepts can guide us throughout the strategic planning process.
