Updates

- 1. UCA Center for Community & Economic Development Park Hill Marketing Project surveys have been distributed and now we are waiting as they are completed and submitted. UCA CCED will do the data analysis and give PHBMA a final report.
- Smart Growth America meeting and planning workshop went well, well attended, though more community involvement is needed. Consultants will put together a report with recommendations to be handed over to the community.
- 3. Metroplan update Board met recently, decided to amend the TIP projects and make Jump Start items line items per comments during comment period. Public comment period ends May 6th, then final approval of TIP projects by Board on May 25th. Still waiting on AHTD to sign engineering contract language. Tentative engineering phase kick off in communities in September. Info correction: Park Hill Elementary has not yet sold, but there is interest and conversations with an interested buyer are occurring.
- 4. UCA Design Think-a-Thon: April 9th 10th. Team of high school student and two undergraduate students worked on issue of marketing Park Hill neighborhood and businesses. Created mockup of a developer packet to use to woo new developers to the area, as well as a mockup of a new potential event, Battle of the Bands. Hopefully students will be able to come to Park Hill and present with Bernadette and Jenna to the members of the PHBMA. Also, the Park Hill team was the OVERALL WINNER OF THE EVENT! Way to go team!
