

Helpful Hints for Residents

1 Make a list of your valuables, complete with serial numbers and pictures and keep it in a safe location away from your home. If there is a fire or a burglary, the list will help law enforcement and make filing insurance claims much faster and easier.

2 Have smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors on every level of your home and in every bedroom. Keep them clean and test them regularly. If you do not have smoke detectors in your house and you are a North Little Rock resident the NLR Fire Department will install smoke detectors in your house at no cost to you.

3 Have your house number visible from the street. Numbers should be on the house and should be at least three inches tall. Numbers should be in contrast to the color of the house to make them more visible. Extra minutes emergency responders spend searching for your address could cost someone their life.

4 Shred credit card offers before putting them in the recycling. Also shred any mail that has credit information on it. Never answer emails or phone calls supposedly from credit card companies asking for account information about your credit cards. The City of North Little Rock will never call you and ask you for credit card information over the phone.

5 If you get a phone call asking for a donation to a charity, always ask for printed material before committing to making a donation. Also ask what percentage of your donation goes to the charity itself and what percentage goes to the company asking for the donation. You may be surprised.

6 Tornado sirens are designed to alert people outside of their houses so they will know to seek shelter. The sirens are not intended to warn residents inside buildings. Weather radios, televisions, radios, smart phones, tablets and the internet are better sources for warning you of impending storms when you are inside your home. You should have a battery operated weather radio so you can still be informed if electricity goes out.

7 In case of a major disaster you should be prepared to spend a minimum of three days on your own with no outside assistance. Preparations should include clean water, food, medicines, pet food, extra batteries, ways to keep warm and to keep cool, lighting, and a means to keep track of the disaster in case of power failure. Know where your gas meter is (and how to turn it off in case of emergency), your electrical box is, and where your water meter is. You should also have a "get home safely" bag in your car and at work. This bag should include dust mask, glasses, gloves, flashlight, water bottle, medicines, rain jacket, comfortable walking shoes, hat, etc. Plan ahead and make sure your family knows where to meet in case there is a disaster and you are separated from each other. Have a secondary meeting location in case the first is unreachable. Remember that cell towers may be overloaded with callers but that text messages may be more likely to get through. Keep your cars and trucks full of gas.



Tire Safety --

If your tires are old enough to be in first grade you need to replace them.

According to recent statistics 11,000 accidents a year are caused by tire failure. More than 10,000

people are killed in rollover accidents each year. In fact, 1/3 of all vehicle fatalities happen in rollover accidents. Tire failure is a major factor in rollover accidents.

One reason tires fail is because they are old. Tires that are six years old or older are more likely to experience blow outs than newer tires. The risk of blowout increases significantly every year over six years of age. Safe driving courses will save you money on your car insurance.

By state law, if you take a driver safety course your insurance company must give you a discount on your car insurance.

The course is good for three years. Courses can be found online.

Besides checking your tire's tread, inflation, wear, alignment and looking for lumps on the sidewalls of your tires, you should also check the date of your tires. All tires have a Department of Transportation (DOT) manufacturing code on them. Look for the four digit number on the sidewall of your tires next to the "DOT" stamp. The first two digits of the four indicate the week of the year the tire was made. The last two digits tell you the year of manufacture. So, "2115" would indicate the tire was made the twenty-first week of the year 2015. If you have a tire with a three digit code, that tire was made before the year 2000. "219" in that case would mean the twenty-first week of the year 1999 or 1989.

If your tires are six years old or older, you should think of "retiring" them and getting a new set. And now you know how to make sure the tire dealer is selling you younger tires.

Curb Alert!

With the spring weather upon us many neighborhoods may see an increase in curb painting services. Street addresses printed on the curb does not sufficiently meet legislative requirements.

Please remember that anyone going door-to-door must have a current city business license and a city issued photo ID badge.

Ordinance #7093, states -- "The owner of each residential or commerical building shall cause to be displayed the street number of the property somewhere upon the building or property in a fashion to allow identification of the property from the nearest right-of-way. The numbers shall be no less than three (3) inches in height for residential structures and six (6) inches in height for non-residential structures. The color of the numbers shall contrast the background to promote visibility. Street addresses printed on a curb shall not be sufficient to meet this requirement."

If you are contacted by someone offering to paint your curb ask to see their city issued license. If they do not have one contact the police at 758-1234.

Peddlers

Anyone going to door-to-door selling merchandise in North Little Rock is required to have a business license and a cityissued ID. They must carry the ID when they are selling and show it when asked for it. The city issued ID has the seller's picture on it, the city logo, a description of the seller and an expiration date. The hours they can legally sell are from 9 am until 8 pm Monday through Saturday. They cannot sell on Sundays. It is unlawful to solicit donations or sell any item or service on a public street. If someone comes to your door to sell and does not have their ID with them, we suggest you contact the police department at 758-1234 or 911. The police will determine if they are legitimate and let them know where to get the permit and ID.
